





# International exchange programs with European (Erasmus+) and non-European countries for the 2021/2022 academic year Call for applications to select exchange students

### 1. Bilateral Agreements

In the context of international university cooperation Luiss Guido Carli has entered into a series of **bilateral agreements** with universities from European (Erasmus+ Programme) and non-European countries. Those agreements are based on the following principles:

- **a.** Students who spend a period of study abroad (normally a semester) remain registered with their home university and are exempt from paying fees and taxes at the host university.
- **b.** The exams that students pass at the host university are recognized as an integral part of their university studies.
- **c.** At the time of signature of each agreement the places available at each partner university are allocated to a specific academic discipline (department, degree program or major) and level (bachelor's degree or master's degree), indicated in the relevant call for applications.

#### 2. Erasmus Charter for Higher Education 2021-2027 - ECHE / Erasmus+ Programme

Luiss Guido Carli for the new Erasmus Charter for Higher Education 2021-2027 – ECHE, for the carrying out of the exchange and education activities envisaged by the Erasmus+ Programme. The outcome will be available in December 2020. The new ECHE Charter of Luiss Guido Carli will be valid from the 2021-2022 to the 2027-2028 academic years.

For exchanges that are part of Erasmus+, approved in the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education, the EU grant will be calculated having regard to the country or group of countries of destination broken down by the cost of living. Considering the constant increase in the number of exchange students, should funding be confirmed it may not always be possible to guarantee a grant for the actual duration of the exchange that covers the total cost of studying abroad. The applicant's guide and the legal basis of the new programme are expected to be available in January 2021. The present Call is subject to the new norms and rules of the programme.

Approval of the ECHE National Call as well as confirmation and finalization of the amount of EU co-funding will take place by summer 2021.







#### 3. Eligibility

The selection process is open to:

- **a.** students enrolled in a **bachelor's** degree program at the Departments of Political Science, Business and Management, and Economics and Finance who are in their second year in the 2020-2021 academic year;
- **b.** students enrolled in the **single-cycle master's** degree program at the Department of Law who are in their second, third or fourth years in the 2020-2021 academic year;
- c. students enrolled in a master's degree program at the Departments of Political Science, Business and Management, Economics and Finance, and Law who are in their first year in the 2020-2021 academic year.

#### Compatibility with other programs

#### The selection process is open to:

**a.** Students who apply for any Double Degree and Structured Partnership programs published in December 2020.

For more information on the list of double degree programs, reference should be made to the calls for applications published by the International Development Office.

Students who submit applications further to both the call for applications for international exchanges and a call for applications in relation to the above programs and who end up winning and accepting a place for one of those programs will be automatically excluded from the call for applications for international exchanges before the compilation of the ranking lists.

- **b.** Students who submit applications for the paid **Cass Semester Abroad (London)** program. Students who win a place for two programs (the paid Cass Semester Abroad and an international exchange), may choose between the two programs immediately after the publication of the ranking lists for the international exchanges.
- **c.** Students who participate in the **Stanford Summer Term** program subject to checking the academic calendars of the exchange locations to verify whether there is any overlap.

#### The selection process is not open to:

**a.** Students enrolled in the second year of the bachelor's degree program in Economics and Business in mobility during the 2020-2021 academic year at the University of Utrecht as part of





the structured partnership (those students can participate in the selection process in their postgraduate studies).

- **b.** Students enrolled in the first year of a master's degree program in mobility during the academic year 2020-2021 and participating in a mobility program in the same year.
- **c.** Students enrolled in the first year of a master's degree program who have been preselected for a double degree programs that envisage the mobility in the 2021-2022 academic year.

Students will have to refer to the calls for applications issued by the International Development Office for details, procedures, conditions and expiry dates of the single calls for applications, available at the following link

Students may participate in **just one Erasmus**+ **or Bilateral exchange** in each undergraduate or graduate cycle.

Students of master's degree programs who have already participated in Erasmus during their bachelor's degree programs may apply for an Erasmus+ location other than that where they studied previously as Erasmus students.

Students of the single-cycle master's degree program in Law who have already participated in an international exchange program (Erasmus+ or bilateral exchange) or in the "Semester Free Mover" program may submit applications to participate in the selection that this call for applications concerns solely for the remaining places that cannot be allocated to students who have not already participated in an international exchange program. In that case their score will be calculated also on the basis of the exams sat abroad and whose results have been recorded by 23 February 2021.

Applications may not be submitted for the 2021-2022 academic year by students who are abroad (for an international exchange program or for the "Semester Free Mover" program) or who are participating in a virtual or blended mobility during the second semester of the 2020-2021 academic year.

#### Submission of applications

Students can submit their applications solely using the candidacy form in their personal web age accessed through the web self-service (https://luiss.esse3.cineca.it/auth/Logon.do).

The application, together with the required attachments, must be submitted online from 11 January and **by noon on 31 January 2021** by accessing the form through the menu International Mobility - Luiss Outgoing Students.





#### The following documentation (with scans to be in pdf format) must be attached to the application:

- **a.** A copy of a **valid ID** (*passport or national identity card*). Students applying for a bilateral exchange location (except for locations in Switzerland) must necessarily attach a copy of a passport that does not expire before June 2022: should that not be possible it will be necessary to attach a copy of a valid ID and a copy of the application for issuance of a passport.
- **b.** Certificates concerning IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge, etc., when compulsorily required by the partner university (it is advisable to carefully read the list of locations and the places available).
- **c.** Copy of certificates, if any, concerning knowledge of language(s). Certificates that are not easily legible will not be taken into account.
- **d.** Cover letter (in Italian or in English) addressed to the Student Mobility Office. That document must be written by the candidate explaining the reasons for applying. The choice of language used has no bearing for selection purposes.
- e. Students of master's degree programs must attach certification (or self-certification) of their bachelor's degree with the list of exams sat. Self-certification forms for degrees awarded by Luiss can be downloaded through the web self-service and be attached without signature to the application.

Students may submit just one application, in which they may however list up to nine locations in order of preference, chosen from among those specified in Annex A to this call for applications.

The locations indicated in Annex A to this call for applications are reserved for students of a specific department, major, specialization and/or year of a program. Those limits must be adhered to, failing which the chosen location will be deleted from the application by the Student Exchange Office of its own motion.

Students must choose the host university taking into account the compatibility of the academic offering there with their own degree program or major (for some locations it may be possible to obtain recognition solely for electives), indicating solely the locations of actual interest and considering that students could well end up being allocated their least preferred location.

Candidates whose applications are found to:

- Be incomplete or erroneous as regards essential elements;
- Not be submitted using the special purpose online form furnished by the University;
- Contain untrue documents or statements;

will be automatically excluded.







Applications from students who have not duly paid their tuition fees will not be accepted. Luiss Guido Carli disclaims any liability in relation to applications that are not received due to technical issues or matters that fall within the remit of third parties. The Student Exchange Office strongly advises not waiting until the last minute to submit applications.

#### 4. Method of Selection of Candidates

#### 4.1. Criteria of academic merit and language proficiency

Students will be selected on the basis of the **criteria of academic merit** (number of credits and weighted grade average) and language proficiency. For the purposes of calculating the score of each candidate, reference will be made to the academic records held by the Student Office on the 23 February 2021. Therefore, it is up to each candidate to check that those records are accurate.

Set out below are further details:

#### A. Number of credits:

For selection purposes account will be taken of **all credits earned and recorded by 23 February 2021** (including credits earned from internships, languages, seminars, soft skills, summer schools, courses brought forward, etc). Credits earned from additional courses (**corsi liberi**) will not count.

The minimum number of credits required depends on the degree program and year of enrollment.

- 1. Students enrolled in the **second year** of a **bachelor's degree program** in the 2020-2021 academic year must have the following **minimum credits** to their name:
  - Economics and Management: 40 credits
     on a total of 82 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Management and Computer Science: 48 credits
     on a total of 98 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Economics and Business: 40 credits
     on a total of 86 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Political Science: 40 credits
     on a total of 90 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Politics, Philosophy and Economics: 48 credits
     on a total of 98 credits obtainable within the Winter session





- 2. Students enrolled in the second, third and fourth years of the single-cycle degree program in Law in the 2020-2021 academic year must have the following minimum credits to their name:
  - second year: 52 credits
     on a total of 102 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - third year: 75 credits
     on a total of 157 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - fourth year: 106 credits
     on a total of 218 credits obtainable within the Winter session
- **3.** Students enrolled in the **first year** of a **master's degree program** in the 2020-2021 academic year must have the following **minimum credits** to their name:
  - Gestione d'Impresa: 12 credits
     on a total of 42 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Corporate Finance: 12 credits
     on a total of 32 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Amministrazione, Finanza e Controllo: 12 credits on a total of 34 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Marketing: 12 credits
    on a total of 40 credits obtainable within the Winter session for the 'Analisi e Misure di
    Marketing' and the 'Gestione dei processi e delle relazioni di marketing' majors
    on a total of 36 credits obtainable within the Winter session for the 'Market Relations &
    Customer Engagement' and the 'Marketing analytics & metrics' majors
  - Global Management and Politics: 12 credits
     on a total of 34 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - International Relations: 12 credits
     on a total of 28 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Policies and Governance in Europe: 12 credits
     on a total of 34 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Governo, Amministrazione e Politica: 12 credits
     on a total of 36 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Law, Digital Innovation and Sustainability: 12 credits
    on a total of 28 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Management: 14 credits
     on a total of 34 credits obtainable within the Winter session
  - Economia e Finanza: 16 credits
     on a total of 38 credits obtainable within the Winter session for the 'Banche e Intermediari
     finanziari' major
     on a total of 28 credits obtainable within the Winter session for the 'Economics' major
     on a total of 30 credits obtainable within the Winter session for the 'Finance' major







#### B. Grade average:

Weighted grade average equal to or higher than 26/30 (with no rounding applied). For the purposes of calculating grade average account will be taken of all exams sat and recorded by 23 February 2021.

Some universities require a weighted grade average higher than 26/30, as specified in Annex A to this call for applications.

#### C. Knowledge of foreign languages:

The selection process takes into account langue proficiency in English, French, Spanish or German. Candidates must know the language associated with the host institution, certifying a minimum level of:

- B2 for English;
- B1 for French or German;
- A2 for Spanish.

However, the majority of universities requires a higher minimum level, in some cases proven by official certification, as specified in Annex A to this call for applications. In some cases that certification may be substituted by an International Baccalaureate, final school leaving qualification or foreign degree. In order to establish their actual situation students should contact the Student Mobility Office at least two weeks before the deadline for submitting applications in order to allow time for verifying the situation with the partner university.

If the chosen location requires TOEFL and/or IELTS (or other) certification with a certain minimum score, the relevant certificate must be attached to the application by the deadline laid down in the call for applications. Those certificates are valid for two years and must not expire before September 2021 for students leaving in the first semester and before February 2022 for students leaving in the second semester. Students who do not yet have the relevant certificate in their possession may attach provisional documents issued by the certification body that clearly evidence the score obtained, the date of the test and the candidate's code. Documents that simply evidence registration or sitting of tests/exams without however specifying the score obtained will not be considered.

In the event of failure to achieve the minimum language level required for allocation of the location(s) indicated or the specific official certification required, the chosen location will be deleted from the application by the Student Exchange Office of its own motion.

Language proficiency may be certified through Luiss language levels, external language certification or *ad hoc* language tests.

· Luiss language levels





Account will be taken of the levels recorded by the University Language Center from 1 September 2018 onwards, including those from previous study cycles. Those levels will automatically appear at the time of submission of the application and it will not be necessary to attach any certificate to evidence the levels in question. For students enrolled in a master's degree program at the Department of Political Science or in the fourth year of the single-cycle master's degree program in Law, the level shown at the time of submission of the application could differ from the actual level held by the applicant. That can happen when the recording of the results of the English language exam/assessment occurs after submission of the application, in which case the above mentioned actual level will be taken into account. The level obtained during the admission test at Luiss, or certificates submitted to that end will not be considered.

#### External language certification

Any language certificates must be attached to the application by the deadline. Please upload only certificates related to languages relevant to this call for applications that meet the admission requirements of the specified locations or that are useful for the assignment of a language level not otherwise recognizable.

The admissibility and validity of any such certification will be assessed by the Student Mobility Office and the Student International Relations Academic Commission at their absolute discretion.

The Student Exchange Office and the Commission also reserve the right to have students undergo tests aimed at verifying the level of their language proficiency. Should the level differ significantly from that certified by the student, whatever disciplinary action is deemed appropriate will be taken.

For the purposes of the selection process that this call for applications concerns, solely language certification obtained after **1 January 2017** will be considered. What is relevant in this regard is the date of the sitting of the test/exam and not the date of issuance of the certificate.

External language certificates must comply with the requirements set out hereunder:

#### English

**Solely** the following certificates will be accepted:

- IELTS;
- TOEFL;
- Cambridge FCE, CAE, CPE;
- Assessment test sat at the Trinity School of Rome after 1 January 2020.
- Degree certificate for language courses clearly indicating the CEFR language level achieved.

### French, Spanish and German





DELE, DELF, DALF, TCF, TFI and Goethe-Zertifikat will definitely be accepted. For students enrolled in a master's degree program, account will be taken of the levels attained during the bachelor's degree program done at another university subject to attaching official CEFRL certification regarding the language in question issued by the said university. **Mere self-certification** will not be accepted as proof of language proficiency.

Any other certification will be assessed at the absolute discretion of the Student Exchange Office. To receive confirmation regarding the validity of any certificates it is wished to submit, students should email the Student Mobility Office (**relint@luiss.it**) well in advance of the deadline for submitting applications. It should be noted however that under no circumstances will certificates regarding online courses (e.g. Babbel, Lengalia and OLS) be accepted.

In any case certificates must:

- indicate the candidate's particulars;
- specify the CEFRL language level attained (or table of equivalence);
- state the date of attainment of the level;
- be printed on the headed paper of the institution and bear the latter's stamp or signature.

For students who have a Luiss level valid for the purposes of this call for applications and who submit an external certificate, the level evidenced by that certification will be taken into consideration only if it is higher than the Luiss level.

#### Ad hoc tests

In the absence of Luiss or official certification, applicants must sit an **ad hoc test** organized by Luiss.

Applicants must register for the test when submitting their application.

The test is open solely and exclusively to students for whom the University Language Center does not have a Luiss language level record dating from 1 September 2018 onwards (including attained during a bachelor's degree program). Students who attach language certification but do not have a Luiss language level may opt to sit the test, in which case the result thereof will replace the level evidenced in the attached certification.

The tests will take place online and will include a written and an oral test. In the run up to the test each candidate will be informed of the virtual classroom to connect to in order to take the said test.

The tests will be held on the following dates (dictionaries cannot be used during the test):

# FRENCH language test Manufactor Colonia 2021 from 9.5

Monday 8 February 2021, from 8:30 a.m.







# SPANISH language test Monday 8 February 2021, from 12:30 p.m.

# GERMAN language test Tuesday 9 February 2021, from 8:30 a.m.

# ENGLISH language test Tuesday 9 February 2021, Aula from 11:30 a.m.

Students who in addition to sitting the above tests are also scheduled to sit the tests organized by the University Language Center for the formation of language learning groups should sit solely the tests organized for the call for applications for international exchanges, which will be valid also for language learning group formation purposes.

Students who have taken the English test organized by Luiss for participation in a double degree program will not be able to take the above test. For those students, the level previously obtained will be used.

#### · Presumed language levels

The following categories of students are **deemed** to have the following presumed language levels:

- students enrolled in a degree program or major taught in English: third level of proficiency in English (B2.3-B2.4);
- students with a foreign secondary school leaving qualification or a bachelor's degree taught in a foreign language: second language bracket (C1). In order to be awarded this level, it will be necessary to attach a certificate (and not, therefore, a self-statement) that clearly and unequivocally indicates the language of study and the passing of the exams. Without such a specification, it will not be possible to recognize the presumed level.

The above presumptions operate solely where the University Language Center does not have a record of a different level dating from 1 September 2018 onwards (including attained during a bachelor's degree program).

As they are merely presumed levels, students who are assigned them may demonstrate that they have a different language level by sitting the *ad hoc* tests mentioned above. In that case, the result of the test will replace the previously presumed level (be it lower or higher). As an alternative to the said test, students can attach certification of a higher language level to the application.

No presumed language level will be assigned to native speakers or those who hold foreign citizenship. Those students will have to demonstrate their language proficiency in one of the ways mentioned above. #### 4.2. Compilation of the ranking lists

The **ranking lists** will be compiled based on the criteria of academic merit and language proficiency explained above, taking into account the order of preference of the locations requested by the students.

A score will be calculated for every candidate on the basis of which each one will be included on the ranking list in decreasing order. That score is given by the sum of the weighted grade average and the total percentage credits earned so far compared to the total credits to be completed by the end of the session (credits earned + credits to be obtained, multiplied by 15). The resulting figure will be adjusted by the percentage assigned to the language proficiency level band. The ranking lists will be complied by computer.

In short: {weighted grade average + [(credits earned / credits to be completed) \* 15]} \* (1 + 0.01 \* language adjustment coefficient).

The language adjustment coefficient is calculated as follows.

The **languages associated with the preferences expressed** by the candidate are taken into account, deceasing progressively with the priority of the choice expressed (for example, the candidate chooses the first three locations associated with Spanish, the fourth and fifth associated with English and the last two associated with French). Should the student also request one or more locations associated with a fourth language, that will not have any bearing on the coefficient.

Please note that at least half of the courses to be taken at the host university must be in the language associated with the choice of location.

The maximum language coefficient is 20 points, which is obtained on the basis of the candidate's abilities in these proportions:

1st language: up to 12 2nd language: up to 6 3rd language: up to 2

Each language is subdivided into proficiency bands, which determine what portion of the bonus points specified above the candidate is entitled to:

The coefficient is thus determined summing the percentages obtained of the bonus points of the first, and if any, the second and third languages.

# For the students of the degree program in Law, the score so obtained will be increased by 1% for every exam passed in English at Luiss.

In the event of a tied score the Student International Relations Academic Commission will take into account the following factors listed here in order of importance: the level of proficiency in the foreign language associated with the first location selected, the number of grades *cum laude* (only within the same study cycle), the weighted grade average without decimal points, and the *cover letter*. For students enrolled in a master's degree program, the degree grade obtained in the bachelor's degree program will be taken into account before the level of proficiency in the foreign language. For students of the degree program in Law, in the event of a tie, priority will be afforded to any students selected under the 2020-2021 call for applications who have not actually participated in an exchange (in-person or virtual) in that academic year due to the pandemic.

In accordance with current personal data protection law, it will not be possible to publish the rankings. The awarding of the place won can be viewed through the web self-service around mid-March, at the end of the selection process. At the same time, a notice will be published on the website and the outcome of the selection will also be communicated to all candidates by e-mail.

Applications will be assessed at the **absolute discretion** of the Student International Relations Academic Commission, consisting of Professors Cinzia Calluso, Federico Carlini, Francesco Cherubini, Barbara De Donno, and Maria Jell Ojobor.

#### 4.3. Disabled students

Students with disabilities may submit their candidature for the mobility program covered by this call for applications. In this regard, it should be noted that the Student Mobility Office will do its utmost to ensure that the experience is able to be enjoyed in a totally satisfying manner. In order to identify appropriately equipped locations, a prior assessment of the type of disability and the necessary compensatory measures will have to be carried out.

Taking into account academic merit and language requirements, the International Student Relations Commission reserves the right to award one or more places at locations capable of suitably hosting the candidate, to candidates with certified **severe disabilities**.

It is therefore strongly recommended that these students contact the office staff **promptly** - no later than **two weeks after the** publication of this call for applications - so that there is sufficient time to make the necessary assessments. After this deadline, these students will still be able to apply but it will be more difficult to try to secure them an adequate experience and/or reserve places.







After being selected for an Erasmus+ location on the basis of the call for applications for international exchanges, disabled students may check with the Student Mobility Office regarding the possibility of receiving financial aid for special needs. Any contribution will be based exclusively on the real costs actually incurred abroad.

#### 5. Procedures after the assignment of a location

#### 5.1. Renunciation of the assigned location

The assigned location will be deemed accepted unless explicitly renounced by emailing the Student Mobility Office (relint@luiss.it) as soon as possible and in any case within 3 days after the publication of the notice regarding the outcome of the selection. Once that deadline passes, it will be possible to renounce solely in cases where, during the phase of approval of the study abroad plan, at least 3 Luiss courses (electives and mandatory, including assessments/idoneità) have not been recognized. In that case renunciation must be communicated the day after the approval of the plan.

Any renunciations for grave and documented reasons of force majeure will be assessed on a case by case basis by the Student International Relations Academic Commission.

Renunciation of the allocated location implies renunciation of participation in the exchange program for the 2021-2022 academic year.

Renunciation of the allocated location after the passing of the deadline therefore and in any case within a timeframe that does not enable the place to be taken by another student will be reported to the Vice Rector for Teaching. After consulting with the Dean of the Department concerned and the Head of Teaching and Research, the Vice Rector will consider the reasons given and should they be deemed to be inadequate the President of the Degree Exam Commission will be informed for the purposes of taking it into account when judging the student's overall academic studies at the University.

Under no circumstances will it be possible to swap the allocated location with that of another student.

#### 5.2. Repechage from waiting lists

Students who despite fulfilling the requirements set out in this call for applications are not allocated a location due to demand exceeding supply will be put on a waiting list.





Vacancies for a location that open up as a result of renunciations will be filled by candidates on the waiting lists that requested those locations, chosen on the basis of their position on the ranking list for the location concerned, **compatible with the deadlines and procedures of the partner university** (owing to which it may not always be possible to fill vacancies that arise). Students on waiting lists that are allocated a location will have to accept or decline in a short space of time. In the absence of written acceptance reaching the Student Mobility Office by e-mail to **relint@luiss.it** by the deadline set by the latter, the student will automatically forfeit the place and the next individual on the waiting list will be contacted.

Residual vacancies for locations for which there is no waiting list may be filled by students of other departments who have applied for that host university, consistent with what is provided for in the relevant exchange agreement. Residual vacancies at the Law Department will be offered to candidates of that department who were selected under the 2020-2021 call for applications but did not then actually participate in any kind of exchange (in-person or virtual) in the year in question. Those students will be able to choose whether to accept the location offered or remain on the waiting list for the locations they have requested.

### 5.3. Choice of the semester for studying abroad

In the majority of cases the exchange period abroad is the fall semester. Solely students from the Department of Law, in many host universities, may choose whichever semester they wish compatible with the academic offering of the partner university. After publication of the ranking lists and acceptance of the allocated location, students must communicate their choice of semester by e-mail to the Student Mobility Office at relint@luiss.it, within 3 days after publication of the outcome of the selection. In the absence of that communication by the prescribed deadline, the first semester will automatically be assigned as the exchange period.

### 5.4. Preparation for departure and general meeting

**Between 22 and 24 March 2021** (date and time and venue yet to be decided) two **general meetings will be held online,** attendance at which by **all students admitted to the program is compulsory.** On that occasion students will receive the instructions and documentation necessary to prepare for their departure.

### 5.5. Study abroad plan

At the same time as publication of the notice regarding the outcome of the selection, information will be given about the method for finalizing the study abroad plans (**Learning Agreements**) and associated academic recognition thereof. Indicatively, this should take place between the end of March and mid-June 2021, with the deadlines depending on the specific locations.

Students are solely responsible for preparing the course recognition proposals (*proposte di riconoscimento esami*) to be submitted to their own Department's Academic Coordinator. It is also up to International exchange programs with European (Erasmus+) and non-European countries for the 2021/2022 academic year Call for applications to select exchange students







students to attend to all of the application formalities at the host universities by the deadlines to be communicated.

Failure to comply with the specified procedures and deadlines may lead to exclusion from the exchange program.

### 5.6. Minimum requirement for participation in an exchange program

Participation in the exchange program is subject to attendance at the partner university of courses recognized as equivalent to at least two Luiss courses (therefore excluding any additional course (**corso libero**) or language course). Students whose study plan does not meet this requirement will be excluded from the exchange program.

### 5.7. Acceptance by the host university

After publication of the ranking lists allocating a location to each successful applicant, the formal acceptance of the student is a matter for the discretion of the host university.

#### 5.8. Recognition of exams sat abroad

Upon completion of the study period abroad and after receipt of certification of the exams taken abroad (i.e. the transcript of records) checked by the Head of the Student Mobility Office as regards its content and regularity, the grades obtained abroad will be converted into thirtieths in accordance with *ad hoc* tables approved by the Student International Relations Academic Commission. Students may submit a request to their own Department's Academic Coordinator to decline the grade solely for marks between 18 and 24. The entire recognition procedure requires about 2/3 weeks from the moment of receipt of the final transcript of records.

Bear in mind that since in the majority of cases the transcript of records is received between March and May (for some UK universities it is necessary to wait even up to July), the updating of the student's academic record with the grades obtained during the exchange period could well not happen in time to bring forward graduation to the extraordinary March/April session or to submit an application for enrollment in another university.

### 5.9. Exchange period abroad

Students are required to observe the arrival dates specified by the host universities. In most cases it will thus not be possible to sit exams at Luiss in the corresponding period (in most cases during the September session).

### 5.10. Suspension or cancellation of the international exchange







In case of suspension or cancellation of the international exchange program or if the student is unable to participate due to the laws or regulations of the host country, with particular reference to the COVID-19 pandemic, Luiss will promptly inform the students concerned provided always that the University cannot be held responsible for any expenses or commitments undertaken independently by the student in relation to the above mentioned programs.

#### 6. Economic terms

Students participating in an exchange program must pay their Luiss fees and taxes but are exempted from paying fees and taxes at the partner university. Students have to bear the costs of travel, bed and board, insurance, visas and any admission or registration fees.

In the event of confirmation of funding, all the students who have won a place abroad will receive funding generally meant to cover travel expenses and the higher cost of living. The amount and method of disbursement of such funding will depend on the type of exchange (Erasmus+/bilateral exchange). For participants in Erasmus+, the funds are provided by the EU and vary on the basis of the host country and the duration of the exchange period. For participants in a bilateral exchange, the grants are funded by Luiss and the amount is the same regardless of the host country and the length of the period of study.

The funding could well be topped up by funds from the Ministry of Education, Universities and Research (MIUR) aimed at supporting international student mobility. If that funding is confirmed students will have submit an application therefor in the manner that will be communicated by e-mail to the students selected for an exchange. The amount of the top-up grant, if any, will be means tested (based on a so-called 'ISEE Università' form that the student will have to submit, approximately by the middle/end of May 2021) and will depend on the student's position in the ranking list and the duration of the exchange.

#### 7. Partner university portal

The documentation relating to the universities listed in Annex A to this call for applications can be found on the websites of the partner universities, and can also be viewed through the 'partner university' intranet portal at the following link http://intranet.luiss.it. Also available through the portal are the reports that students prepare upon return from each location, recognized courses and other useful information like the number of requests that were received for each location in the 2020-2021 call for applications.

Please note that Luiss is not responsible for the information contained in the FAQs and fact sheets of the partner universities and that the information published is subject to change.







#### NB

For candidates who are not citizens of an EU member state: in some cases the requirements for studying at a given location are dictated by the immigration policy of the host country. For example, the United Kingdom requires such candidates to submit a certain type of English certification. Candidates should carefully check whether any such specific requirements must be met in relation to the countries that they are interested in.

Non-Italian students could well not be admitted to universities in their country of citizenship. These students are therefore requested to contact the Student Mobility Office to check their actual situation well in advance of the deadline for submission of the application.

Student mobility programs are premised on cooperation between the universities involved, based on the provisions of agreements as amended from time to time. The information published in Annex A regarding the requirements for studying at the exchange locations is the result of intense negotiation aimed at facilitating access for Luiss students (for example, many locations in theory require external linguistic certification but in practice in many cases we are able to obtain an exemption by having language proficiency certified by our own University Language Center).

Although every effort is made to publish reliable information, Luiss is not responsible for any changes due to events beyond its direct control.

# International Exchange Program 2021-2022 Instructions for Filling Out and Sending the Online Application

Applications may be filled out and sent solely online from Monday 11 January to noon on Friday 29 January 2021.

N.B. Once the deadline passes the system for receiving applications will shut down meaning that it will no longer be possible to apply.

### 8. Step - Before filling out the application form.

- Decide your preferred universities.
- Consider whether the academic offering of the host universities is consistent with your own studies.
- Bear in mind the language proficiency levels required by your preferred universities.
- Check your own CEFRL language proficiency level.
- Verify the validity of your own language certificates.
- It is advisable to check out the documentation and websites of the partner universities.
- Arrange to scan the documentation that it is compulsory to attach to the application.

#### 9. Step - Access the online application process

To access the online application process key in your web self-service username and password. Select 'LUISS Outgoing Students' from the menu and click on the magnifying glass icon. Compulsory attachments -TO BE SUBMITTED SOLELY IN PDF FORMAT

- A copy of a valid ID (passport or national identity card). Students applying for a bilateral
  exchange location must necessarily attach a copy of a passport that does not expire before June
  2022: should that not be possible it will be necessary to attach a copy of a valid ID and a copy of
  the application for issuance of a passport.
- Certificates concerning IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge, etc., when compulsorily required by the
  partner university (it is advisable to carefully read the list of locations and the places available).
- Copy of certificates, if any, concerning knowledge of language(s). Certificates that are not easily legible will not be taken into account.





- **Cover letter** (in Italian or in English) addressed to the Student Mobility office. That document must be written by the candidate explaining the reasons for applying. The choice of language used has no bearing for selection purposes.
- Students of master's degree programs must attach certification (or self-certification) of their bachelor's degree with the list of exams sat. Self-certification forms for degrees awarded by Luiss can be downloaded through the web self-service and be attached without signature to the application.

#### 10. Step - Filling out the online application form - before the deadline

- Select your own department. Students enrolled in Corporate Finance will have to select
  the department of Business and Management while students enrolled in Global
  Management and Politics will have to refer to the department of Political Science.
  Students enrolled in Law, Digital Innovation and Sustainability will be allowed to select
  the Business and Management department or the Law one.
- 2. Click on the magnifying glass icon to access details and then on 'Apply for the program'.
- 3. Select up to 9 destination locations using the priority selector in the 'pref.' drop-down menu.
- 4. Select the language for each chosen location.
- 5. The system will display your language proficiency level, if known. Otherwise, select the level from the drop-down menu and select the box 'certification' (you will have to attach your certificates). Alternatively, leave the language field blank and register for a language assessment test by selecting the box 'Sel.' on the right.
- 6. If the required level for one or more destinations is not found in the applicant's records, the system does not allow to continue. To apply for such destinations one must select the 'certification' or language assessment box to instruct the system that the level will change.
- 7. On the next page upload all of the necessary attachments, clicking on the button 'Upload new document'.
- 8. After having checked that the application has been properly submitted, click on 'Print application receipt'.

N.B. Once you have sent the application and printed out the receipt therefor, it will no longer be possible to amend or resubmit the application!







## Tips for filling out the online application form

Adhere to this brief procedure to avoid problems while filling out the online application form to participate in the selection process further to the Call of Applications for International Exchanges 2021-2022:

- 1. You cannot use a **smartphone** or **tablet** to fill out the application form.
- 2. Make sure that your attachments are in PDF form. Otherwise the system will not upload them.
- 3. It is advisable to make sure the file size of attachments is not too big to avoid problems when it comes to uploading them. In this regard it is possible to modify the **settings of the scanner** and/or acquisition software to obtain a resolution of 150dpi and an image size that is not excessive. Ask an expert or visit a photocopying center if you have any problems.

Even if following this procedure you still do not manage to fill out the application form, before the expiry of the deadline for submitting applications (noon on 29 January 2021) we can assist you remotely by booking a virtual meeting during opening hours. Alternatively, you can contact us by phone at 06 8522 5642/5389/5779/5613/5778/5777.

N.B. In light of the large number of requests that we get for assistance, especially close to the deadline, it could well happen that we will not be able to deal with them all. For this reason **it is advisable not to wait until the last minute to submit your application** so as to improve your chances of receiving assistance if necessary.

#### Places and Universities academic year 2021-2022

#### Notes:

The program year refers to the year that students are enrolled in for the 2020-2021 academic year (i.e. at the time of submission of the application). For example, "bachelor's" means that solely students enrolled in the second year of in bachelor's degree program in the 2020-2021 academic year may submit an application for the location in question.

Students must choose the host university taking into account the compatibility of the academic offering there with their own degree program or major, indicating solely the locations of actual interest and considering that students could well end up being allocated their last choice location.

For Law students who have already participated in an international exchange, it could prove to be in bit more complicated to find compulsory courses that will be recognized academically. Therefore, students are advised to be very careful about the universities that they choose.

For universities that offer courses in two languages, for example English/French, students must and can choose just one language. The language chosen and the associated level of proficiency must be indicated in the application form.

Some universities require specific language levels and/or compulsory certification, as specified in the call for applications.

To check how the language levels required by the universities compare to CEFRL and various official certificates, see the table at the end of this document.

Some locations do not offer courses compatible with LUISS compulsory courses. Students may however obtain academic recognition for electives and attend unrecognized additional courses. In most partner universities students do not have access to courses that are taught as part of master's or graduate programs or the like, for example, at universities in Spain, the United Kingdom, and many non-







European countries. Students can check this aspect through browsing the university websites, reading partner university FAQs, or asking Student Mobility office staff.

Bear in mind that some universities require in weighted grade average higher than that needed for eligibility under the call for applications, as specified for the locations in question.

# Interdisciplinary Degree Programs: Corporate Finance, Global Management and Politics, Law, Digital Innovation and Sustainability

For matters related to study plans and agreements with partner universities, students of the abovementioned degree programs will participate in the calls for the following departments:

- Corporate Finance: Business and Management Department
- Global Management and Politics: Political Science Department
- Law, Digital Innovation and Sustainability: Business and Management or Law Department (based on student's choice)

#### UNIVERSITIES IN THE UNITED KINGDOM

Bear in mind that for some UK universities (University of DURHAM, Aston University (for political science), Robert Gordon University, University of LEEDS, King's College, Swansea University) transcripts of records are normally received between July and September, thereby making it impossible to graduate in the summer session and indeed in some cases making graduation in the fall session also unlikely.

At the time of the publication of the present call, the United Kingdom is still in participating country to the Erasmus+ program. Should the situation change, universities in the United Kingdom may be regarded as bilateral institutions. More information will be provided to students selected for said institutions.
